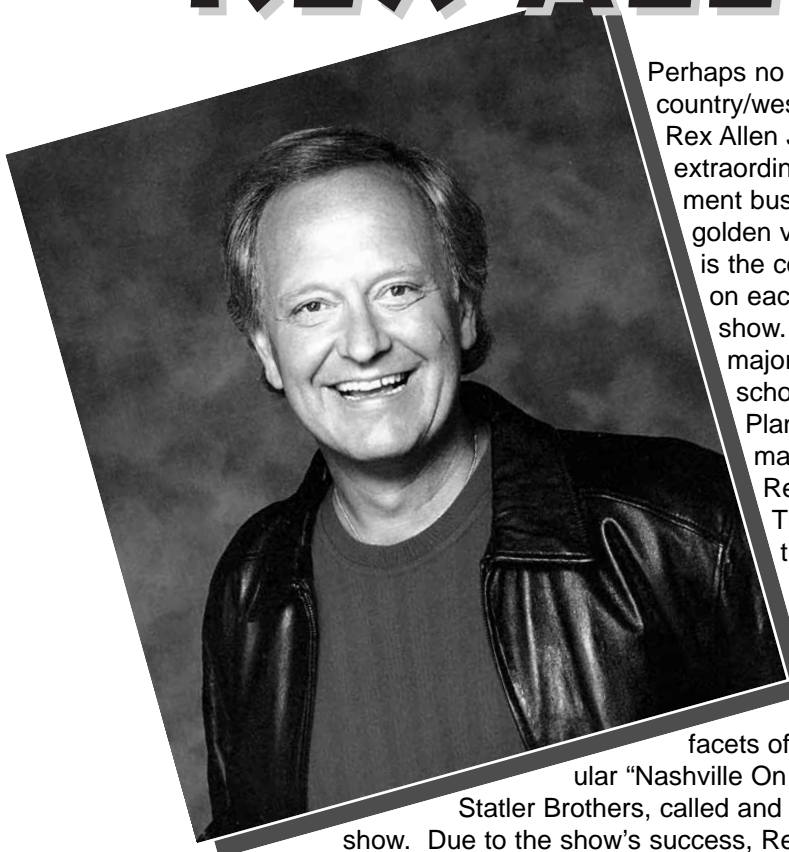




REX ALLEN JR.

Rex went on to become a successful recording artist for Warner Brothers with a steady flow of Top-40 singles including: "Lonely Street" "No No No" and "It's Over." Rex was honored by having his song "Arizona" adopted as the official song of that state in 1982. Rex pursued other facets of his career by co-hosting with Jim Stafford the popular "Nashville On The Road" TV show. In 1992, his old friends, the Statler Brothers, called and offered him a regular slot on their Saturday night show. Due to the show's success, Rex was offered his own show, "Yesteryear" which became the #2 rated show on The Nashville Network.
